I have been Chair for just over a year now, and despite being a challenging year for NHP, the resilience and dedication towards our communities has shone through.

Like other charities and businesses, NHP has been affected by the cost of living crisis. We have seen all our outgoings rise dramatically this year.

The food we serve at our Children's Centres, our heating and lighting, and the maintenance costs of our buildings have all increased. Recruitment in the Early Years sector continues to be challenging, not only for NHP, but right across the UK.

As an organisation, we are very conscious of the impact this has had on, not only our staff, but all the families that access our facilities.

It all sounds very gloomy, but there is a positive side! NHP has had another extremely successful year delivering services and supporting families across our communities.

We were able to hold our first staff away day since the pandemic and it is amazing to see how dedicated our staff are to the needs of our families and communities.

This hard work and dedication is highlighted in the following pages; from our Children's Centres to our Neighbourhood team.

Some of these include the £10,000 funding secured for our Household Support Fund, £60,000 for the Healthy Holidays (HAF) Programme and the return of the Junior Wardens. This is just a fraction of what our teams have achieved this year. You will see inside that there is a lot more to celebrate.

We continue to look to NHP's own carbon footprint, looking at ways this can be reduced. This has included fitting LED lights in four of our centres to reducing photocopying and printing. Even the Trustee Board has gone paper free with paperwork being provided online.

The coming year will still be challenging, but as an organisation we will adapt and continue to support our communities. We will see some changes with the introduction of Family Hubs and there will be celebrations as NHP celebrates its 25th anniversary..

Thankyou to all the families, volunteers, staff and Trustees that make NHP such a success.

Children, Young People and Families

Community plays an exceptionally important role in a child's development. This is why we provide a range of services for parents and carers and their young children across our **Children's**Centres.

The core purpose of our Children's Centres is to improve outcomes for young children and their families, with a particular focus on those in greatest need. We support parents to make sure children are ready to achieve their full potential. As well as providing day care, we offer a variety of community based services.

Our **Neighbourhood team** work with smaller groups of young people in schools focusing on developing environmental awareness and skills.

With a focus on adult wellbeing, **Staying Well** support a range of parents to develop social networks, connect into communities and make healthier choices.

We know that mental health is just as important as physical health. In these turbulent times over the last few years, protecting the mental health of ourselves, our families and our communities has been a priority.

Case Studies

Rose self referred into the project after seeing a Staying Well postcard in her local supermarket.

Rose had recently lost her husband and was adjusting to living alone. Although Rose had the support of her family she felt the need to increase how often she went out independently—particularly to socialise.

Rose worked with Staying Well to link in with local walking groups and social events—she is now feeling less isolated and more independent from her family.

Joyce and **Alison** have been befriending each other since February 2022 and have since decided that they no longer need Staying Well to continue what has become a friendship.

Joyce has also been re-befriended by Aisha with the calls beginning this week.

During the year:

We continued to work closely with Public Health regarding the development of an Integrated Health and Wellbeing system.

Our Befriending Network has been reviewed, updated and continues to thrive.

Staying Well supported the funding of local organisations to hold events for the International Day of Older People.

We had staff and volunteer training in Mental Health First Aid, Managing Anxiety, Stop Smoking and Stammering Awareness.

Strengthening Communities



A partnership was developed with Calderdale Council, Active Calderdale and Friends of Shroggs Park to develop plans to make Shroggs Park safer, more welcoming, more accessible, attractive and sustainable. The partnership is coordinated by us and we hold £50k of funding attained from Active Calderdale to support community led investment in the area.



The Neighbourhood Team undertook 16 community walkabouts, engaging over 80 residents.



£30,000 of Council Ward Forum grants were distributed to 70 small scale community projects and groups. This included the support of improving local green spaces and support for local sports teams.

Learning and Development

We deliver a range of courses and training to help people into employment and learn new skills.

Our Family Learning courses are fully inclusive and open to all parents and carers, whether you are at home caring for a child, a working parent, or on maternity/paternity leave.

We also provide accredited training in areas such as paediatric first aid and food hygiene, with childcare available at some sessions.

We work closely with other local organisations to help people return to work or find training.

We provide support in:

- Interview skills

- Further training

Volunteering

Our volunteering programme provides training and work experience opportunities, with many volunteers progressing into permanent work within our charity or employment in the wider community.

20 Volunteers joined our Staying Well Befriending scheme. A befriending library has been set up so that all the volunteers can easily access suggested books from Calderdale libraries.

- 5 Children's Centre volunteers undertook 1241 hours of work.
- 4 Breastfeeding peer support volunteers undertook 191 hours work.

Here at North Halifax Partnership, we are committed to reducing our carbon footprint.

We teach children and young people about environmental issues, including in our nurseries, visiting schools and supporting Junior Wardens.

We have an internal Climate Action Group that works together to plan and implement eco friendly alternatives.

Going paperless

One way we have worked towards this is by using an online DBS service.

We have work from home opportunities and regularly have online meetings.

We print in black and white where possible and use A5 forms instead of A4 forms.

Food Sustainability

We grow a lot of our own fruit and veg and have our own allotments.

LED Lighting in four Children's Centres

We were awarded a grant to install LED lighting which can be 80% more efficient.
